#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

We, the undersigned, all of whom are citizens of the State of Texas, and all of whom are at least twenty-one (21) years of age, acting as incorporators of a non-profit corporation pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

# ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is Kingwood Service Association, hereinafter referred to as "Association."

#### ARTICLE II

The initial registered office of the Association is located at 2400 Trailwood Village Square, Humble, Texas 77339; and the initial registered agent at such address is G. B. Mitchell, Jr.

### ARTICLE III

The Association is a non-profit corporation and does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit for itself or its directors. The purposes for which it is formed are to

provide for community, civic and social welfare in The Kingwood Area of Harris and Montgomery Counties, Texas, and to promote the health, safety and welfare of The Kingwood Area residents and property owners. For these purposes it is empowered to:

- a. Enter into Contracts with Community Associations and Other Contracting Parties within The Kingwood Area for the purpose of providing such Community Associations and Other Contracting Parties with Common Areas, Facilities and Services of overall benefit to The Kingwood Area residents and property owners in general, including, but not by way of limitation, security, fire protection, parks and recreation, and common area improvements and maintenance transcending Community Association boundaries:
- b. Exercise all of the powers and privileges and perform all of the duties and obligations of the Association as set forth in said Contracts;
- c. Fix, levy, collect and enforce payment by any lawful means, all charges or assessments pursuant to the terms of said Contracts;
- d. Pay all office and other expenses incident to the conduct of the business of the Association, including all licenses, taxes or governmental

- charges levied or imposed against the property of the Association.
- e. Acquire (by gift, purchase or otherwise), own, hold, improve, build upon, operate, maintain, convey, sell, lease, transfer, dedicate for public use, or otherwise dispose of real or personal property in connection with the affairs of the Association;
- f. Borrow money and mortgage, pledge, deed in trust, or hypothecate any or all of the Association's all or personal property as security for money increwed or debts incurred;
- g. Dedicate, sell, or transfer all or any part of the common areas and facilities owned by the Association to any public agency, authority, or utility for such purposes and subject to such conditions as may be agreed to by the directors;
- h. Participate in mergers and consolidations with other non-profit corporations organized for the same purposes;
- i. Convey any park or common area, title to which is held by the Association, to any public entity capable of maintaining and agreeing to maintain the same, at any time or times when funds received by the Association for such park or

- common area is deemed insufficient for adequate operation and maintenance thereof;
- j. Have and exercise any and all powers, rights, and privileges which a corporation organized under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act by law now or hereafter may have or exercise; and
- k. Establish and enforce rules and regulations governing the use, operation, maintenance, control, and disposition of property to which the Association holds title or to which control is vested in the Association.

#### ARTICLE IV

The Association shall have no members.

#### ARTICLE V

Each Community Association or Other Contracting Party which has executed a Contract of Association with the Association may appoint one person as member of an Advisory Committee whose functions shall be to:

- a. Consult with and advise the directors of the Association concerning the needs of The Kingwood Area;
- b. Review the Association's projected annual budgets for operating, maintaining, expanding,

and improving the Association's facilities and services and submit recommendations in connection therewith; and

c. Perform such other duties and functions as may be set forth in the By-Laws of the Association.

# ARTICLE VI

The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Board of Directors composed of such number of persons and for such terms as may be fixed by the By-Laws of the Association. The directors shall continue to serve until their successors are selected and qualified in the manner provided in the By-Laws of the Association. The names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as the initial directors and constitute the initial Board of Directors of the Association are:

#### ARTICLE VII

Each member of the Advisory Committee shall be entitled to cast that number of votes equal to the number of equivalent units represented by the respective member on October 1 of the year immediately preceding the year in which the vote is cast. Recommendations to the directors and other such items as may be prescribed by the By-Laws shall be by a majority of such votes represented at the meeting at which the action is taken. Equivalent units shall be calculated as prescribed by the By-Laws of the Association.

#### ARTICLE VIII

Association costs and expenses shall be prorated among the contracting Community Associations and Other Contracting Parties on an equitable basis as set out in the By-Laws.

#### ARTICLE IX

The Association shall exist perpetually or until it is dissolved. Dissolution of the Association shall require the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the directors of the Association. Upon dissolution, other than incident to a merger or consolidation, the assets of the Association shall not be transferred to or received by any individual, but shall, pursuant to a lawful plan of

distribution, be dedicated to an appropriate public agency to be used for purposes similar to those for which the Association was created. In the event that such dedication is not accepted, the assets shall be granted, conveyed, and assigned to any non-profit corporation, association, trust, or other organization to be devoted to such similar purposes.

#### ARTICLE X

Amendment of these Articles shall require the assent of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the directors of the Association.

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 1396-4.03 of the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, on May 18, 1984 the undersigned director adopts the following Articles of Amendment to the Articles of Incorporation of the corporation which adds a clarification sentence regarding update of authorized agent and address removes the term "fire protection" and adds the term "dispatching services," changes "advisory committee" to "Board of Directors", states By-Laws, will prescribe Board rules, meetings, and Equivalent units Criteria, and deletes Article V and renumbers the subsequent Articles.
